

LTW—Rehabilitation & Healing Centre
The Aboriginal Sobriety Group Indigenous
Corporation provide care and support for
Aboriginal people who wish to live an
alcohol and drug free lifestyle.

LTW is a nonmedical dry rehabilitation centre located on a farm at Monarto. Clients live in for a 12—24 week period and are assisted through a number of programs to recover from alcohol or other substance misuse lifestyles.

Prior to entry, clients must take a needs assessment with ASG's substance misuse program to ensure they are ready for stabilisation and receive appropriate care. This includes a period of detoxification at a hospital or relevant centre.

Programs include AOD education, skills development, counselling, culture, art and woodwork, gym, gambling support, Centrelink, access to GP, daily activities and chores, computer and internet access.

Programs may be tailored to suit individual clients.



One of the founding members of the Riverland Aboriginal Men's Support Group, Reggie Black has been unwell and in the Royal Adelaide Hospital for the last six weeks. He has recently returned to the Riverland Regional Hospital and is slowly recovering. From last reports Reggie is in good spirits, chatting up the nurses!

Reggie has been a mentor to many Aboriginal students at many Riverland schools over the years and to community members in general through his last role at Life Without Barriers.
