Rehabilitation (Lakalinjeri Tumbetin Waal)

LTW is a non-medical 'dry' rehabilitation centre located on a farm at Monarto. Clients 'live-in' for a 12 – 24 week period and are assisted through a number of programs to recover from alcohol or other substance misuse lifestyles.

Prior to entry, clients must undertake a needs assessment with ASG's Substance Misuse Program to ensure that they are ready for stabilisation and receive appropriate care.
