AOD Prison Counsellors

ASG and the Department of Corrections have been providing Aboriginal people in custody support with AOD counsellors. Tammy Rankine is a Ngarrindjeri Women and Brian Gollan is Ngarrindjeri/Kokatha man. This program has been travelling well and both workers currently have a full case load throughout the five prisons ASG attend.

Our AOD prison counsellor's provide clients with a one on one hour session each visit. Our aim is to support clients with AOD relapse prevention, understanding of clients recovery plans centered around the changes needed to prevent relapsing, identify the disparity between the positives and negatives of their drug use and provide them with support and information about how to avoid risks and triggers, cope with cravings, manage anxiety, shame and guilt and self- esteem. Supporting our clients in the Legal system also and advocating and walking along side together. Our Holistic Counselling service also provides group sessions with culturally safe space.

The team also provides outreach support when released back into community.

The AOD prison counsellor's visit the following prisons on the following days <u>Tuesday</u> - Cadell Training Centre, The first Tuesday of every month as well as phone link up (if possible) once a month <u>Wednesday</u> - Yatala Labour Prison <u>Thursday</u> - Mobilong every
