







Big (Sunday) things happening at LTW

Big Sunday has partnered with ASG and Fund My Community to refurbish an existing building on the Monarto Property to create a House for Hope. This house was in poor condition having been vacant and unused for the past seven years. Big Sunday was successful in their grant application through the Fund My Community evaluation process and was allocated the monies to facilitate the full refurbishment of the property. The purpose of the renovation was to create a live-in programme specifically for Indigenous men or women with the help of over 30 different volunteers and trades. New life has been given to the home once again through minor demolition and the installation of a new kitchen, bathroom, floor coverings, LED down lights, a full repaint and upgrade of the hot water system and electrical services. Assistance from LTW clients Chris and Leroy with preparation and painting of the windows has been a great help. Handover of the property back to ASG is proposed for Saturday 10th October. The Team and volunteers at Big Sunday love being involved in projects just like this and are passionate about making a difference in our community.


