Mobile Assistance Patrol

Mobile Assistance Patrol (MAP) continues to have a high demand for transporting individuals who are vulnerable, under the influence of alcohol and other drugs, and at risk of harm or being involved in anti-social behaviour minimising the contact with the justice system. Lowering rates of incarceration of clients encountering SAPOL with-in the Adelaide CBD, in which MAP works closely with SAPOL to prevent clients being incarceration or having contact with the justice system.

LTW Rehabilitation Centres

Prior to entry, clients must undertake an assessment with ASG's **Substance Misuse Team** to ensure that they are ready for stabilisation and receive appropriate care.



Lakalinjeri Tumbetin Waal (LTW) is a mens non-medical 'dry' live-in rehabilitation centre located on a farm at Monarto. Clients live-in for a 12 - 24 week period and are assisted through a number of programs to recover from alcohol or other substance misuse lifestyles.



Leila Rankine - House of Hope is a women only non-medical rehabilitation centre located next to our men's rehabilitation farm at Monarto. It provides a livein program for a 12 - 24 week period and are assisted through a number of programs to recover from alcohol or other substance misuse lifestyles.
